I mean, I can jot down a note in OneNote Mobile on my iPhone, sync it with my SkyDrive, and then download it to my computer. I can also do this in the opposite direction: Type it up on OneNote on my computer, upload it to my SkyDrive, get it on my iPhone (or Windows 7 phone). Or...create a note or add to existing notes from within my SkyDrive, send them to the phone...etc.

As a matter of fact, I just now copied a recipe I found online into OneNote on my computer, it popped up on my SkyDrive...and *bing!* it's on my iPhone and ready to be taken into the kitchen at dinner time (*Risotto Milanese*).

As you may or may not know OneNote for the iPhone was released in the U.S. in January of this year, 2011. I was positively gleeful because if you know anything about the Crabby Office Lady, you know that I have one heck of a soft spot in my wrinkled old heart for baby OneNote. Yes, since 2003, that program and I have been best buds. And now that it comes purse-sized, well, I can take it anywhere!

On April 26th OneNote Mobile 1.1 for the iPhone came out and it really has some additions (and yes, improvements) to it, a lot of these being implemented due to customer feedback.
